PURPOSE: The aim of the symposium is to provide a scientific forum that highlights innovative basic and translational science advancements in pancreatic cancer. The goal is to disseminate new scientific information to accelerate the translation of novel preclinical science into clinical trials.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES:

Upon completion of the course, attendees will be able to:

- Describe the ways in which the pancreatic cancer immune environment provides challenges for modulation, and what avenues are being pursued to overcome barrier to effective immunotherapy.
- Outline the current landscape of evidence for the use of systemic and local therapy in the perioperative setting, and develop best practices for how to apply clinical trials data into practice.
- Identify the pros and cons of proton beam therapy and its specific utility in the treatment of pancreatic cancer.

EDUCATIONAL METHOD: The format will include lectures from leaders in the field. Upon completion of each speaker's talk there will be an opportunity for open debate and discussion. There will be dedicated time available between presentations for attendees to discuss cases one-on-one with course faculty members. A live audience response system will be utilized to assess learner preand post- understanding of topics.
