The Medical College of Wisconsin Department of Surgery Advances in Minimally Invasive General Surgery Symposium will be held on Saturday, September 23, 2023. The symposium will take place at the GMS 1097 Classroom in the Gehl-Mulva Science Center, MCW-Green Bay campus, located at 161 Reid Street, De Pere, WI 54115.

PURPOSE: The aim of the symposium is to familiarize the audience with the current status and future directions of diagnosis and treatment for hernias, morbid obesity, and biliary tract, esophageal, stomach, and metabolic diseases.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES:

Upon completion of the course, attendees will be able to:

- Understand the national recommendations for the management of choledocholithiasis.
- Describe the indications, contraindications, side effects, and outcomes of newly approved medications for the treatment of obesity.
- Describe the latest endoscopic interventions for the treatment of obesity.
- Determine the appropriate surgical approach and mesh repair options for hernias, considering patient input, cost-effectiveness, efficiency, outcomes, and evidence-based guidelines.

EDUCATIONAL METHOD: The format will include lectures from leaders in each field. Upon completion of each speaker's talk there will be an opportunity for open debate and discussion. There will be dedicated time available between presentations for attendees to discuss cases one-on-one with course faculty members. A live audience response system will be utilized to assess learner pre- and post- understanding of topics.

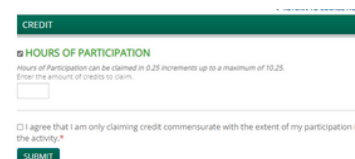

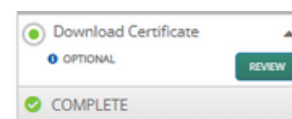
