The Medical College of Wisconsin 2024 Vascular Symposium will be held on March 15, 2024, at the Brookfield Conference Center, located at 325 S. Moorland Rd, Brookfield, WI, 53005.

TARGET AUDIENCE: Vascular Surgeons, Cardiothoracic Surgeons, General Surgeons, Cardiologists, Nurse Practitioners, Physician Assistants, Nurses, Residents, Fellows, Allied Health Professionals who are involved in the care of patients with vascular disease.

PURPOSE: This educational symposium is designed to highlight a broad range of topics relating to vascular disease. It will familiarize the audience with natural history, surgical techniques, avoidance of complications and new technology.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES: Upon completion of the course, attendees will be able to:

- Develop a protocol for shared decision making for patients considering a carotid artery intervention.
- Develop criteria for appropriate use of lower extremity vascular interventions in their institution for patients with both claudication and chronic limb-threatening ischemia.
- Describe appropriate indications for venous intervention for both acute and chronic deep venous thrombosis.
- Create an algorithm for the contemporary management of type B aortic dissection, both complicated and uncomplicated.
- Recognize the consequences of failed EVAR and will learn the indications for a timely intervention. Current guidelines will be discussed in collaborative case reviews and panel discussions.
- Develop a protocol for appropriate longterm management (medical and surgical) of patients who survived repair of type A aortic dissection.

EDUCATIONAL METHOD: The format will include lectures from leaders in each field, panel discussions, and case presentations led by moderators. There will be ample opportunity for questions and discussion.



Patrick Edward Muck, MD, RVT, FACS, is the Chief of Vascular Surgery at TriHealth Good Samaritan Hospital in Cincinnati, Ohio. Dr. Muck is also the director of the Vascular Fellowship and Residency Programs. He has been involved in numerous FDA trials for peripheral arterial interventions, abdominal aortic aneurysms and carotid stenting systems. He currently serves as the Chairman of the International Committee for the American Venous Forum and as President-Elect of the Midwest Vascular Surgery Society. Future interests are focused on percutaneous thrombectomy platforms.

Simon R. Fraser, DO, is a vascular surgeon at OhioHealth, practicing at OhioHealth Doctors Hospital and Riverside Methodist Hospital in Columbus, Ohio. He received his medical degree from the Ohio University Heritage College of Osteopathic Medicine and completed his general surgery residency at OhioHealth Doctor's Hospital. Dr. Fraser was subsequently a vascular surgery fellow at the Medical College of Wisconsin. Dr. Fraser was previously a professional athlete with the Atlanta Falcons before his transition to medicine.





William Sheaffer Sorrells, MD, is a vascular surgeon at Cardiothoracic & Vascular Surgery Associates, P.A. in Jacksonville, Florida. Dr. Sorrells earned his medical degree from the Medical College of Georgia at Augusta University.
